<b>Context/additional information</b>
<p>Christ Church CofE Primary School had an OFSTED inspection in November 2024 and received judgements of 'Inadequate' for the Quality of Education and Leadership/Management.</p> <p>Since then, the school has appointed a new headteacher, Matthew Wynne, who began in post in February 2025. He and his leadership team have worked very hard with support from both the Local Authority and Fioretti Trust to raise standards.</p> <p>This report provides an overview of some of the highlights over the last year to show some of the significant progress the school has made during that period.</p>
